



From the Principal ...

Restrictions lifted in Schools

We are thankful for the new lifting of restrictions and hope the following guidelines will help:

- Masks are optional for all JK 8 students: Masks for students and staff are no longer mandatory and will remain optional for those who choose to wear them. We understand that many students, parents and teachers may choose to keep masks on at school and we trust all of us will fully respect this personal choice. Thank you in advance for respecting this choice. Parents, please reinforce this mutual respect on the home front as teachers have talked with students about supporting each other's choices in this area.
- **Pre-screening before school:** Although we fully expect our parents to continue to pre-screen for all student illnesses, you will no longer see this formal request from the TCS office each morning. Thank you parents in advance to being diligent and careful in this area.
- All cohorting will be dropped on the playground and in the school. Students will be able to mix both outside and inside the school with fellow grades as they were before any of the restrictions.
- **Library:** We are presently preparing and updating the library and the computer system and hope to have this all running soon.
- Band: We hope to start band up again over the next few weeks.
- **Chapels:** We hope to start chapels sometime in April as we have several new projectors (for the gym and music room) that are on order that we hope to have in place by early to mid-April. We will have a few inhouse chapels first to get into routine again before we move into full chapels with parents later.

What will remain:

- Students and staff only in the educational wings: For the comfort zone of parents and staff, we will be keeping the educational wings to students and staff only during school hours. We have found this has significantly helped with security and health reasons and it will remain in place. Staff will be able to schedule parent meetings (in advance) after school hours in classrooms once students have left for the day.
- **Isolation times:** We are still receiving information about isolation times for those who have COVID and those who are exposed to a family member with COVID. For now, check with public heath direct on this issue.

As we walk through the next few months as a school community, we look forward to *staying deeply united and supportive of each other* as we put COVID restrictions in our rear-view mirror. Please note there is still some anxiety among parents to stay safe and careful and so we ask our community to be as understanding as possible in this journey. Thank you TCS parents in advance for this deep care for one another.
